team over MSMEs

GUWAHATI, June 27: A high level delegation of the Federation of Industry and Commerce of North Eastern Region (FINER), headed by its chairman RS Joshi had a meeting with Dr KK Jalan, Secretary, MSME, and Prabhat Kumar, former Cabinet Secretary and former Governor (Jharkhand) and Chairman, National Policy on MSME Committee, Government of India, during their visit to Guwahati on Sunday.

The delegation, while appreciating the steps taken by the ministry for the development of MSMEs, not only in the North East, but in the entire country, apprised it of the issues related to the MSMEs prevalent in the North East.

The challenges faced by the MSME sector in the region, difficulties in getting financial

assistance from financial institutes towards the MSME sector, government procurement policy of the MSME sector, etc., were among the issues raised by the delegation.

It requested the officials to take steps to address them for the overall development of the region.

The delegation also submitted a memorandum during the meeting. The Secretary, MSME and Chairman, National Policy on MSME Committee, gave a patient hearing to the delegation and appreciated the inputs and suggestions submitted by it, and assured it that the ministry would try to address the issues based on the inputs submitted by FINER.

FINER also requested that a separate policy exclusively for the MSMEs of the North East be launched for development of the region.

CME programme on paediatric epilepsy

GUWAHATI, June 27: The GNRC Hospitals here conducted a continuing medical education (CME) programme on paediatric epilepsy on June 25. The event was attended by over 100 specialists in neurology and paediatrics, apart from several general practitioners.

The CME was conducted by Dr Ashakatha Radhakrishnan, Additional Professor, Neurology Department, Sree Chitra Tirunal Institute for Medical Sciences & Technology, Thiruvananthapuram.

Dr Ashakatha is a renowned epileptologist and has published numerous papers on the subject. She was awarded the "Young Investigator Award" during the 28th International Epilepsy Congress held at Budapest in 2009 and the "National Bioscience Award for Career

Development 2011," for outstanding contribution in the development of state-of-the-art technologies in the management of refractory epilepsy patients.

Speaking on the occasion, Dr Nornal Chandra Borah, CMD, GNRC, said: "Studies by National Centre for Biotechnology Information (NCBI) show that there are 50 million people living with epilepsy worldwide, and most of them reside in developing countries. About 10 million persons with epilepsy are in India. Many people with active epilepsy do not receive suitable treatment for their condition, leading to large treatment gap. Neurocysticercosis (NCC) has been a serious threat amongst children as well. NCC has been implicated in 0.4 per cent of all neurological complaints. It is important for everyone to be proactive and cure the disease before it becomes a serious threat."

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
